QUESTIONNAIRE REGARDING LOSS OF ALIEN REGISTRATION CARD

Thank you for your recent inquiry concerning the loss, theft, expiry, or non-receipt of your Alien Registration Receipt Card ("green card").

To enable you to return to the United States as a resident without an alien registration card or expired alien registration card, it will be necessary to verify your U.S. permanent resident status. If you have any secondary evidence showing that you were admitted into the United States as, or adjusted status to, a permanent resident and have subsequently maintained resident status, this office may issue letters confirming that you are a lawfully admitted alien resident. These letters may then be presented to the airline and Department of Homeland Security Inspector in lieu of your alien registration card.

The transportation letters will be valid for two weeks from the date of issue and only for one entry. You should personally apply for transportation letters 2 weeks prior to your return to the U.S. Issuance of transportation letters does not guarantee you entry into the United States. Permission to re-enter the U.S. as a legal permanent resident without your green card or with an expired green card will be determined by the Department of Homeland Security Inspectors at your first port-of-entry.

If you have no suitable secondary evidence of your resident status, this office will need to contact the U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS) in Bangkok to verify your permanent resident status.

- Alternative secondary evidence of your permanent resident status (including USCIS stamps in your current and/or expired passports), correspondence from USCIS etc., should be brought to the Consulate at the time of your personal interview.
- Please e-mail sydneyiv@state.gov to request an appointment date to lodge your application for transportation letters. You should also advise us of the date you hope to depart for the U.S.
- Please bring with you your original current passport, bank check or postal money order of USD165.00 made payable to the U.S. Consulate, Sydney, original airline travel tickets used at time of departure from the U.S., original boarding pass or other evidence showing complete date of last departure from U.S., and one recent passport sized color photograph of yourself. The processing fee is non-refundable regardless of whether or not the transportation letters are issued.
- If secondary evidence is insufficient and USCIS confirmation is required, you will be notified at the time of your interview. A minimum of ten working days is generally required to receive a reply from USCIS.
